# Expenditure of Funds for the Care, Treatment, and Rehabilitation of Individuals

- The Foundation supports 9 pediatric centers/hospitals in and around the Capital District (DC, MD, TN, and VA)
  - Children's National Medical Center, Washington, DC
  - Johns Hopkins Children's Center, Baltimore, MD
  - University of Virginia Health Center, Charlottesville, VA
  - Children's Medical Center, Virginia Commonwealth University, Richmond, VA
  - Carilion Clinic Children's Hospital, Roanoke, VA
  - Christiana Care Pediatric Trauma Unit, Wilmington, DE
  - Niswonger Children's Hospital, Johnson City, TN
  - Children's Inn at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Bethesda, MD





# Promotion of Kiwanis Sponsored Service Leadership Programs (SLPs)

- The Foundation subsidizes the Capital District Circle K budget
- The Foundation provides annual scholarship support for Key Club and Circle K (Robert H. Turner, Jr. Scholarship)
- Youth Outreach Sponsorship Program: Kiwanis Clubs can annually donate \$100 to support non-sponsored SLP programs throughout the district:
  - K-Kids – Elementary School
  - Builder's Club – Middle School
  - Key Club – High School
  - Circle K – College
  - Aktion Club – Individuals with disabilities, 18 years and older



# Support of Communities Working Towards the Betterment of Lives for Children

● The Foundation awards grants for monetary donations from \$100 up to \$5,000

- Priority is given to projects that align with the mission and vision of Kiwanis – serving the children of our world
- Two funding cycles are awarded each year:
  - Fall (Postmarked by September 15th and considered by the board in November)
  - Spring (Postmarked by March 15th and considered by the board in May)
- Funds are valid for one year in length, and clubs are only able to apply for three consecutive years





# Promotion, Development, and Welfare of the Capital District of Kiwanis International

- The Foundation provides a monetary award of \$2,500 for the Teenager of the Year (TOY) recognition program
  - Recognizes deserving teenagers for their academic achievements, citizenship, service to their school and community, growth and responsibility in his/her family unit, character and leadership performance.
  - Competition occurs at the local club, division, and district levels
  - Award is presented each August at the annual Kiwanis District Convention



# Annual Club Gifts

- Suggested donation of \$3 per member
  - \$5 per member to qualify as a distinguished club
- Gift can be made between October 1st and September 30th
- Monetary amount is based on the club's October 2020 confirmed roster on the Secretary's dashboard in Kiwanis Connect

- \$1,000 contribution
- Recipient receives a certificate and a plaque
- Full amount of the contribution is invested



## Founder's Society

- \$1,000 contribution
- Endowment fund created to help benefit Service Leadership Programs (SLP)
- 50% of the contribution is endowed, and the other 50% goes directly to our SLP clubs
- Recipient receives a Founder's Society neck medallion ribbon, engraved shadow box display case, and a lapel Founder's Society pin



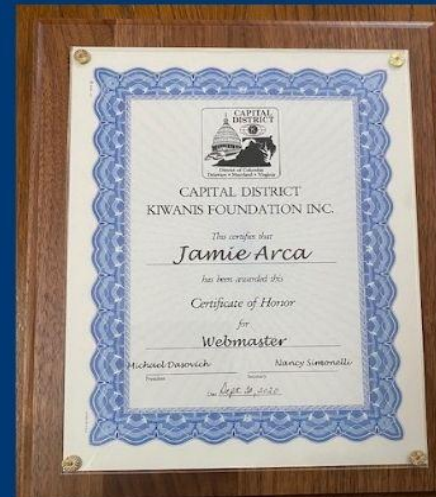

# Expected Income 2020-2021

## Based on history

Investments	\$ 58,900
Ducky Derby/Caring Corner	\$ 11,000
*\$3 Per Member (this assumes less than 100% participation from every member in each club)	\$ 10,000
<u>Other Income</u>	<u>\$ 5,400</u>
Total	\$ 85,400

*Deficit will be subsidized using funds from investments.  
Still running a deficit, but closer to funding commitments.*
